 Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do
 make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in ^{or} manner
 and form as follows Revoking and Confirming by these presents
 all and every Testament and Testaments Will and Wills heretofore by
 me made and declared either by word and this is to be taken only
 for my last will and Testament and none other that is to say
 Principally and first of all I give recommend my Soul to God
 that gave it and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in the
 Christian as my Executors think fit nothing doubting but at
 the General resurrection shall receive the same by the mighty
 power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it please
 God to bless me with in this lifetime I give devise and dispose of the same in
 the manner form as follows that is to say first I will that all those
 debts and dues I owe in right or conscience to any manner of Person
 or Persons at or when shall be well and truly contented and paid
 or to be paid within convenient time after my decease by my
 Executors hereafter named. I give bequeath unto my Daughter
Sarah Dickson one Shilling Sterling I have and bequeath
 unto my Daughter Elizabeth Dickson one Shilling Sterling. I
 leave bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Dickson one horse named
Dugy. I have and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Dickson
 the Plantation I now live on during her life together with all the
 Goods and Chattles also an negro woman named Chamberly that
 doth belong unto me and after her decease and all to be left unto
 my Daughter Ann Dickson providing that she marrys
 she shall find sufficient maintenance for the Orphan as
 the Executors think fit. I have and Appoint William
Douglas and Benjamin Dickson to be my only and sole
 Executors of this my last will and Testament this and

none other to my last will and Testament In Witness
 hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above
 more all after the decease of the widow all is to be the wife
 whole Estate mentioned, mentioned

 to examine the same. The subscribing as well as several other
 Witnesses were of Opinion that the same ought to be
 established as the Will of the 1st Testator and thereupon
 the said William Douglass made Oath to the same
 according to Law and on his written Certificate was
 granted him for obtaining a Probate hereof in due
 form.
