I John Fullerton of Halifax County being of sound mind do make this my last Will and Testament in the following manner, to this I bind unto my loving wife Sally Fullerton after paying all my just debts, all the balances of my estate both real and personal during her natural life undat her death it is my will and desire that all my land should be equally divided between my two sons, Samuels John, and it is my desire that as long as any of my daughters live single, that they may have the privilege of living on the land that I gave to my two sons and no longer, and it is my will and desire, at the death of my wife Sally Fullerton, that all my personally estate is to be equally divided between all my surviving children, I hereby appoint my loving wife Sally Fullerton, Icham Britter and Jonathan Vaper Executors to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this thirty first day of March eighteen hundred and threes.

At a Court held for Halifax County the 27th day of June 1803

The within written last will and Testament of John Fullerton deceased was exhibited in Court & proved by the oath of two of the witnesses thereto Subscribed - and ordered to be record - and at another court held for the said County the 20th day of September 1803 - The same was again exhibited in Court - and on the motion of Icham Britter one of the Executors therein named - who made oath according to law: Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form - He giving security whereupon he together with John D. Scott and Henry E. Coleman his Councillors intend unto and acknowledge their bond in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs - Security being given to the other Executor, Glimmin Abbott to join in the probate thereof when they shall think fit.
